On the weekend that marks the legacy of Martin Luther King Jr. join us for a reading of Pretty Fire. Charlayne Woodard's one-woman autobiographical play chronicles her African-American family's experiences through three generations. This NAACP award-winning play-reading is a fitting way to reflect on the challenges still before us as we celebrate Martin Luther King Jr.'s Legacy. This compelling play tells the story of two young sisters in the small world of Albany, New York; of Ku Klux Klan riders burning a cross—the ironic “pretty fire” of the title—in the hilltop Black town of Rosignol Hill, Georgia. PRETTY FIRE is an enthralling celebration of life that takes the audience on a universal journey through a world in which the family bond is as strong as steel. Discussion, fellowship and refreshments will follow this 75-minute reading. Information will be available about the Summit Interfaith Council's Anti-Racism Committee and the NAACP, and ways to support their work, continuing Dr. King's Legacy.
